History made at 2019 Nebraska Truck Driving Championships

GRAND ISLAND – A rare win by a rookie and a champion performance by the competition’s only female driver brought the crowd to their feet at the 2019 Nebraska Truck Driving Championships (NTDC). The Grand Champion Award went to Eric Stein of Werner Enterprises. Christina Gaines of FedEx Express took first place in the straight truck competition.

The Nebraska Trucking Association organized the May 31-June 1 event at Fonner Park to highlight the best professional truck drivers in the state. Competitors demonstrated knowledge, talent and skills which focus on what it takes to be a safe driver on our streets and highways.

Eighty-five drivers participated in this year’s championships in nine classes of trucks. Drivers competed in pre-trip inspections, written exams, oral interviews with the Nebraska State Patrol and they finally tackled a challenging driving course. In one such challenge, drivers had to back a 65-foot long, 8--and-a-half-foot wide truck and trailer all the way through a 10-foot alley marked by barricades.

Awards were presented based upon scores in the four separate test areas: written examination, personal interview, pre-trip inspection and driving test. Team awards are also given to the company with three or more drivers competing with the highest overall average score.

The 2019 overall grand champion was Eric Stein of Werner Enterprises. Stein also took home the Professional Excellence Award (highest written test) and the Rookie of the Year Award (first-time participant with the highest overall score in all four parts of the competition).

NTDC has a long positive working relationship with the Nebraska State Patrol Carrier Enforcement troopers. The Bucky Buchholtz Top Driver Award, named in honor of Buchholtz, a former Trooper and long-time championship committee member, went to the driver with the highest score on the driving course. This year’s honoree was Terry Durham from Werner Enterprises.

The Kurt Everett Vehicle Condition Award, named in honor of Everett, a long-time championship committee member, goes to the driver with the highest score on the pre-trip inspection. This year’s award winner went to Kevin Zelasney of ABF Freight.

The Jerry Wessel Award, named in honor of a long-time committee member, is awarded to drivers who have competed or volunteered at the Championships for at least five years and are rated on professionalism, industry knowledge and attitude. This year's winner was Terry Durham from Werner Enterprises.

The first-place winner in each of the nine classes advances to the American Trucking Association's National Truck Driving Championships in Pittsburgh, while the mixer truck first place winner advances to the National Mixer Driver Championship.

Also, held during the championships was the Nebraska State Patrol Inspector Championships, consisting of a personal interview, a tabletop hazardous materials exercise and various hands-on inspections. Nebraska State Patrol Trooper Ben Schropfer of Nebraska City took first place honors and Trooper John Hadaway received runner-up honors. Schropfer will now represent Nebraska in the North American Inspector Championships, also held in conjunction with the National Truck Driving Championships
